



APPLICATION GUIDELINES FOR
NATIONAL ARTS COUNCIL-SANGAM HOUSE RESIDENCY 2024-2025

The National Arts Council is pleased to partner with Sangam House (Bangalore), to offer a fully-paid, one-month-long residency for one Singapore Tamil writer in 2024-2025. Via this partnership, Sangam House will commit to set aside one residency place for a Singapore Tamil writer annually.

The final candidate to be selected and funded every year is subject to the merits of the candidates who apply and the competitive assessment criteria as outlined by NAC and Sangam House.

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1. OBJECTIVES OF THE PROGRAMME

This initiative is part of the National Arts Council’s ongoing efforts to:

- Support Singapore emerging literary talent via international partnerships; and
- Enable networking opportunities and cultural exchange with international counterparts, through established writer’s residencies, like Sangam House, which has a significant history of connecting writers from around the globe.

The aim of the NAC-Sangam House Residency is to provide participating writers with the time and space to write, while giving writers a chance to build a solid and influential network of personal and professional relationships that can deepen their own work, and in effect, expand and diversify literature. Their programme also facilitates interaction between the visiting writers and the local arts communities, cultivating an intersection that infuses the local communities with inspiration and new ideas, while allowing

each participating writer to deepen their understanding of the diverse emotional and social climates in which literature is conceived and received.

2. ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for this residency, applicants should:

- a) Be Singapore Citizens or Singapore Permanent Residents who are actively engaged in the literary arts industry and are published writers in Tamil.
- b) Possess a record of past achievements (at least one published book or volume, or a sizable number of works in anthologies, journals, or literary magazines), strong artistic merit, recognition among their industry peers, and commitment towards advancing the art form.
- c) Be in the process of creating an original literary work, at any stage of development.
- d) Be comfortable with cross-cultural dynamics and interested in close interaction with writers and artists from diverse cultures and backgrounds.

3. ASSESSMENT

Applications will be assessed competitively against each other, according to the following criteria:

- a) Artistic merit and potential of the applicant, based on the information provided in the application form, the curriculum vitae submitted, and the writing sample provided;
- b) The applicant's ability to undertake and commit to completing the programme; and
- c) The benefit of the proposed programme to the applicant's creative and professional development.

4. TERMS OF AWARD

The selection process is highly competitive and only one Singapore Tamil writer will be offered the residency in 2024-2025.

The selected participant will be funded for the following:

- return economy airfare,
- visa fees,
- travel insurance,
- two-way ground transport from the airport to the residency destination,
- residency fee payable to Sangam House, which covers lodging and meals during the residency and,
- a per diem to cover incidental expenses not covered by Sangam House (if needed).

5. CONDITIONS OF AWARD

An applicant, upon being notified that their application is successful, shall inform NAC of their acceptance within 14 days from the day of the notification, failing which the award will be deemed to have been withdrawn.

To help NAC in the evaluation and management of the programme, the successful applicant should provide NAC with the following within two months upon completion of the residency:

Written Evaluation Report detailing:

- new creative project/s accomplished during the residency;
- summary of key learning points and residency experiences;
- visual supporting documents (such as pictures, programme schedule, etc.).

Evidence of Work accomplished during the residency period:

- Copy of writing developed during the residency programme, including draft manuscript/s of new work/s.

These reports and draft manuscripts are for archival purposes only and will not be published and/or circulated publicly.

NAC also reserves the right to review or withdraw the programme award should any of the following occur:

- a) The proposed project receiving the funding is changed significantly without the prior written consent of NAC. NAC must be informed in writing of any changes to the proposed project.
- b) The selected participant is not able to deliver the proposed project.
- c) The funding is not used for the purpose for which it was awarded.
- d) Wrong and/or misleading information is provided in the application form, either deliberately or otherwise.
- e) Participation in any illegal or negligent acts during any point of the programme.

6. APPLICATION PROCEDURE

All applications are to be submitted via email (in PDF or Word format) by **22 September (Sunday), 2359hrs** to: Rachannaa VELAYUDHAM from.TP@nac.gov.sg . Late or incomplete applications will not be accepted. The application must include the following documents:

- a) Completed application form.
- b) A brief (two pages, maximum) curriculum vitae of applicant, focusing on applicant's literary works.
- c) A brief (one page, maximum) description of the work to be undertaken while at Sangam House.
Note: This work must be original. But it can be at any stage of development.
- d) A Tamil writing sample, of no more than 50 pages. (Please indicate if the work has been published or is unpublished. If it has been published, please provide publication details.)
Note: Writing sample does **not** have to be in English. Please submit your writing sample in its original language (i.e. Tamil). However, all other documentation must be submitted in English.

The word *sangam* in Sanskrit literally means “going together.” In most Indian languages, *sangam* has come to mean such confluences as the “flowing together of rivers” and “coincidence.” Likewise, the intention of Sangam House is to bring together writers from around the world to live and work in a safe, peaceful setting. Their residency programme is designed for writers who have published to some acclaim but have not yet enjoyed substantial commercial success.

Sangam also harks back to the great gatherings of poets and writers in the southern cities such as Madurai during the period of classical Tamil literature. These assemblies produced some of the subcontinent’s most exquisite poetry and provided a space for writers of all kinds to talk to each other, over generations and genres. Assembling writers from various cultural backgrounds broadens the scope of each individual’s work. Exposure to regional and national trends in literature, to multiple political and economic obstacles and varied social and cultural milieus, enhances each writer’s understanding of their work, as well as their own notions of identity and home. Sangam House recognises the dearth of such opportunities in South Asia and strives to encourage the work of those writing in all languages, regional and dominant. Such a unique environment enriches the work of its participants and the texture of international literature.

The Jamun is a space to leave your mark. This spacious bungalow, set in a quiet, green lane of suburban Bangalore, offers a calm and quiet environment, along with easy access to the city centre. The Jamun hosts a variety of public programmes throughout the year, partnering with some of Bangalore’s best known arts organisations, including Sangam House, an international writer’s residency. Between November and January every year, writers from many different countries, working in numerous languages, live and work in The Jamun’s serene environment. During the residency period, Sangam House and The Jamun co-host public readings by resident writers as a way for them to connect with Bangalore’s literary community. Through its programming, The Jamun aims to be a home for vital conversations about the arts in a changing world. In addition to residencies, they regularly organise free literary talks, plays, music concerts and workshops in a number of artistic disciplines.
